1. 대화를 듣고, 여자 아이가 탈 것을 고르시오.

W: Wow, we're the first here.

M: Which horse do you want to ride?

W: The dotted horse, of course. It looks cute.

M: I like the horse with the cone on its head.

W: Where? (Pause) Oh, behind the striped one. (Pause) Dad, it looks scary.

M: I see. Well.... I think the striped horse would be more fun to ride.

W: I still want to ride the dotted one.

M: Hmm....

W: Okay. Which horse do you want me to ride?

M: How about riding in one of those carriages?

W: Uh.... (Falling tone)

M: Jane, are you with me?

W: You know I am, Dad, but you also know what I want.

M: Okay. I'll go along with your wish.

W: I really enjoyed the dinner. Where's your car?

3. 다음을 듣고, 여자의 요청으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: How would you feel if your parents, your sisters, your brothers, and all the people dear to you were suddenly taken away to the wild salty sea? How would you feel if your school were no longer the one you attended every day, but just a pile of broken bricks? And all this happened in one morning? 4. 대화를 듣고, 파티에 관한 내용과 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.
